

## Scholarships, Bursaries and Awards

A **Scholarship** is awarded for achievement in one or more areas, regardless of financial need.

A **Bursary** is awarded for achievement, but uses financial need as one of the criteria.

### Sources:

#### **Parents:**

Please check with your parents concerning scholarships or bursaries that may be available to you through their places of employment. Information should be available in their Human Resources Department.

#### **Schools:**

Many universities offer entrance scholarships. Most are awarded on a grid and calculated using your top six U and M level courses and do not require an application. You *may* have to apply for some of them. Check the scholarship and bursary information at the universities and colleges to which you are applying.

Other bursaries and scholarship applications for specific areas of study (for example, Engineering, Hotel Administration) will be distributed to students who have applied in the pertinent areas as they are received.

#### **Orillia Secondary School:**

A large number of awards and scholarships are given at Commencement in various areas. Often these awards are teacher- or club-nominated or are for academic proficiency and excellence in many areas. No applications are necessary for these awards; however, ***there will be a mandatory grad profile to complete in the spring. The deadline to return your completed Grad Profile to Guidance will be announced.***

Applications for many listed scholarships and bursaries (unless noted otherwise) are available in the Guidance Office.

In the last few years, donors have withdrawn scholarships because letters of appreciation (thank you notes) were not received by the donating association or individual from the award recipient. If you are fortunate enough to receive an award, **PLEASE** send a note of appreciation so that we may keep all of the awards offered for future graduating classes.
