Background

Ontario Snowmobile Oval Racers is a not-for-profit organization that was founded in 2016 by four individuals with a passion for racing, some big ideas, and a desire to compete in more ice oval races in Ontario. During our first year as an organization we managed to break into the sport of ice oval snowmobile racing and gather a genuine following of racers and fans. Our inaugural race took place in January 2017 in Minden, Ontario, and drew a crowd of over 700 spectators. We have been viewed on TV, and printed in newspapers and magazines. Last year, in our second season we managed the longest running ice oval snowmobile race in Ontario; the Bonnechere Cup in Eganville, Ontario, since 1974.

Volunteer Positions

Event Set-Up and Tear Down: This will include assisting with track set up as required, setting up materials required for the successful functioning of the event such as tables, signs, flags, pylons, etc., and other tasks as determined on race day.

Gate Marshals: Will be responsible for collecting gate admission, ensuring liability waivers are signed by everyone entering the premises, administering wrist bands/tickets, and directing entrants on where to proceed.

Parking/Pit Marshals: Will be responsible for directing entrants to parking as well as collecting pit admission (if required), and checking that all individuals entering the pits have wrist bands/passes to do so. May be required to have entrants sign liability waivers.

Recovery: Will be responsible for retrieving disabled and crashed machines and/or broken parts from the track as well as re-positioning straw bales along track walls.
